Aug 2020- July 2021 - 12 months of cancelled activities and Edie & Lisa left December 2020 & Andrea joined

At the end of 2019 we were doing a lot, but cash was running short. Edie & Lisa had lots of events planned and had started a Golf Day instead of the Charity Ball, we were in the office at EP but that was proving costly

During Covid we invested in Zoom and Edie & Lisa arranged virtual get togethers and persuaded companies and members to attend 'virtual' events and still donate. We managed to secure some significant grants from organisations and companies and these, along with generous gifts from members kept us going.

Since losing Edie & Lisa and replacing them with Andrea and more recently Ceri we have closed the office and are concentrating for now on 'core activities' to support members and not 'big fundraising events'. This is why for the year Aug 2020 - July 2021 our income was only £6,188 but expenditure was £20,619 as at the start of the year we had Lisa & Edie and also were still running the office.
